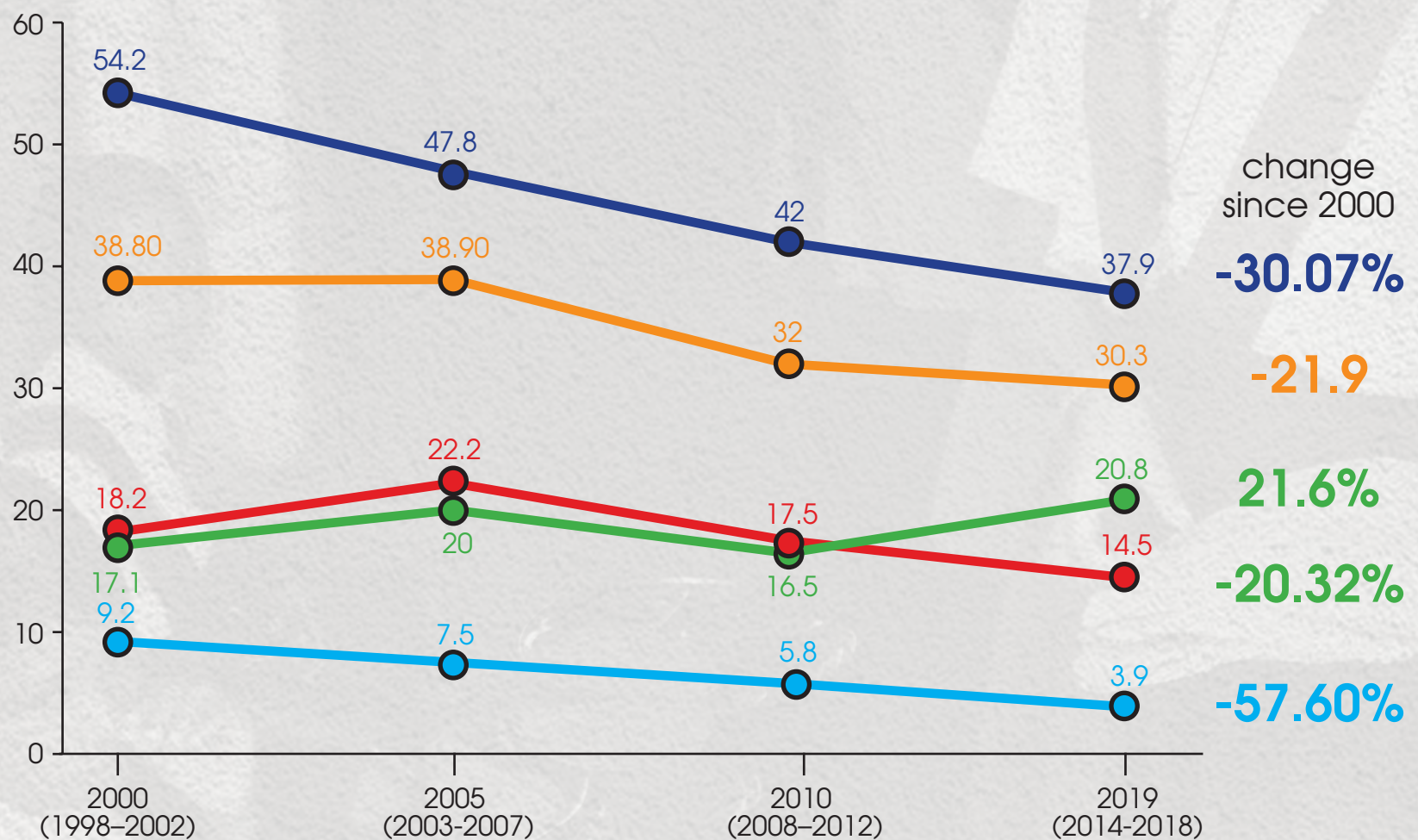


GLOBAL HUNGER INDEX

UNDERNOURISHMENT

Insufficient caloric intake

CHILD WASTING

Low weight for height; reflects acute undernutrition

CHILD STUNTING

Low height for their age (those under 5); reflects chronic undernutrition

CHILD MORTALITY

Mortality rate for those under 5; reflects fatal mix of inadequate nutrition and unhealthy environments

The Global Hunger Index (GHI) is a tool that measures and tracks hunger globally, by region, and by country.

The GHI is calculated annually, and its results appear in a report issued in October each year.

The first GHI was published in 2006; Calculations were for 1981, 1992, 1997, and 2003.
